Candidates must be available at least 1 weekend per month for a couple hours each morning. Shifts are generally scheduled one month in advance. We can be flexible to accommodate changes in schedule on a month to month basis.

DUTIES:**

Responsibilities include in-hospital patient recruitment, consenting, data collection, data entry and adhering to numerous protocols and procedures related to securing data and maintaining data accuracy. Data collection includes measuring the walking speed of hospital inpatients. If candidate has interest and skills, there may also be opportunities to participate in cleaning the data set, preparing and scoring surveys, generating subsets of the data and contributing to data analysis.
