EEO Students: Junior & Senior Year Undergraduate	Complete didactic and clinical courses successfully as per the undergraduate academic program plan. Substitute PhD courses where recommended (e.g. N706)
Program	Meet all standard undergraduate program progression criteria ¹
	Complete honors research experiences as contracted with honors faculty advisor
	Identify potential major professors and formally apply for the PhD Program in Nursing
	Attend a research group regularly
First Year (full-time*)	Develop preliminary program plan (including minor area of study) in consultation with advisor
	Complete courses successfully as per program plan (Minimum graduate GPA of 3.00. No more than 1 grade below a "B" or a "U" grade in any 12 month period.) ²
	Complete guided research experiences (i.e. N990, N999) as contracted with advisor
	Attend research colloquia regularly
	Develop preliminary statement of research focus and potential research questions
	Develop a timeline for NRSA submission or other external grant that supports PhD education or dissertation
Second Year (full-time*)	Finalize program plan (including minor area of study) in consultation with advisor
