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


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Degree Audit Reporting System (DARS)

1. Shows progress toward degree completion
 - Real-time snapshot of satisfied, in-progress, and needed requirements
2. Uses symbols to depict progress
 - Requirement Status: OK, NO, IP
 - Sub-Requirement Status: +, -, IP-, IP+
 - Key Words: EARNED, IN-PROGRESS, and NEEDS



Degree Audit Reporting System (DARS)

1. Run a DARS report by following these directions: <https://kb.wisc.edu/94056>
2. Make sure to run a Pre-Nursing DARS
 - You can also run a What-If DARS for other majors
3. Take notes on:
 - What you have completed (OK or + symbol)
 - What you have not completed (NO or - symbol)
 - What's in progress (IP, IP+, IP-)

Parallel Planning

- You must identify a parallel plan (alternative plan) in addition to planning for nursing
- Your parallel plan is vital in the event that your interests/plans/strengths change or you do not gain admission to nursing
- Finish the sentence:
 - “If I’m not admitted to nursing, then I’ll...”
- Cross-College Advising Service (CCAS)
- Center for Pre-Health Advising



Possible Parallel Plans

1. Complete a Parallel Major

- Examples on next slide!

2. Complete a Different Major and Return for a Nursing Degree

- Two-year or accelerated degree programs (12–15 months)

3. Transfer to Another Nursing Program

- Research to learn about admission timelines, prerequisites, etc.

Note: Reapplying is *not* a parallel plan. Reapplying can be *part* of a Parallel Plan, but it's not *the* plan.



Some Possible Parallel Plans

- Health Promotion and Health Equity (HPHE)
 - School of Education
- Human Development and Family Studies
 - School of Human Ecology
- Psychology/Sociology/Social Work/Spanish
 - College of Letters and Science
- Biology/Nutritional Science/Global Health
 - College of Agricultural and Life Sciences
