## Eligibility & Degree Requirements

- 1. 54 credits
- 2. 2.75 cumulative GPA
- 3. Prerequisite Courses
  - Chemistry (requires Math 112)
  - Microbiology (requires Chemistry)
  - Anatomy
  - Physiology (requires Bio/Zoo 101 + Chemistry)
  - Psychology
  - Sociology
  - Human Growth and Development
- 4. 2.75 prerequisite GPA

## Parallel Planning

- You must identify a parallel plan (alternative plan) in addition to planning for nursing
- Your parallel plan is vital in the event that your interests/plans/strengths change or you do not gain admission to nursing
- Finish the sentence:
  - "If I'm not admitted to nursing, then I'll..."
- Cross-College Advising Service (CCAS)
- Center for Pre-Health Advising



### Possible Parallel Plans

- 1. Complete a Parallel Major
  - Examples on next slide!
- Complete a Different Major and Return for a Nursing Degree
  - Two-year or accelerated degree programs (12–15 months)
- 3. Transfer to Another Nursing Program
  - Research to learn about admission timelines, prerequisites, etc.

Note: Reapplying is not a parallel plan. Reapplying can be part of a Parallel Plan, but it's not the plan.

- Health Promotion and Health Equity (HPHE)
  - School of Education
- Human Development and Family Studies
  - School of Human Ecology
- Psychology/Sociology/Social Work/Spanish
  - College of Letters and Science

### **Application Timeline & Review Process**

Application Instructions and FAQ Published: November 2022

Application Opens: December 1, 2022

Application Deadline: January 15, 2023 (11:59pm CT)

Confirm Eligibility & Review Applications: January-March

Zoom Interviews: mid-March to mid-April

Admission Decisions Sent: mid-May (via email)

Applicants given one week to confirm or decline offer

Waitlist Monitored throughout summer

## Online Application Sections

- 1. Personal & Applicant Information
  - Fill-in-the-blank questions (name, contact info, etc.)
- 2. Academic Information and Educational History
  - All colleges/universities attended
  - Prerequisite completion details
- 3. Work Experience and Involvement Section
  - Could include: health care experience, work experience, leadership, activities, volunteering, achievements, etc.
  - Up to 5 most notable activities/experiences
- 4. Personal Statements (short essays)
  - 6 required, 1 reapplication essay

## Interview/Writing Prompt

You will be invited to participate in a Zoom interview after your application has been reviewed and confirmed to have met all the eligibility requirements. Interviews are required and applicants will be assigned a date and time. Reschedules will not be allowed unless there are extenuating circumstances. The interview will have two components:

#### **Group interview** (20 minutes)

 The group interview will include two interviewers and four applicants. The interviewers will facilitate the interviews and ask the applicants a series of questions.

#### Writing exercise (20 minutes)

• The writing exercise will be completed individually. There is no preparation required.
